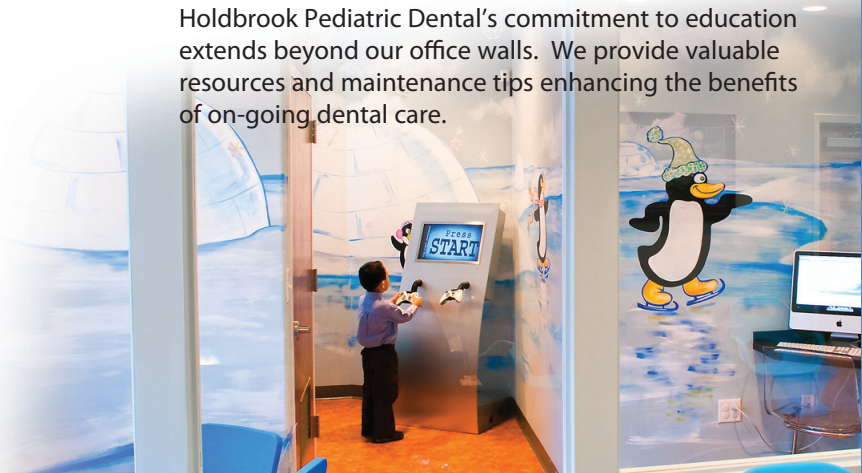

Conscious Sedation

Q: What is conscious sedation?

A: Conscious sedation is a management technique that uses medications to assist children cope with fear, reduce anxiety and cooperate with dental treatment. Medications and dosages are weight specific and carefully selected for each individual child.

Q: Who should be considered for sedation?

A: Children who have a high level of anxiety, or those who are very young and do not understand how to cope in a cooperative fashion for the delivery of dental care, should be considered for treatment while under sedation. This procedure is also often helpful for some children who have special needs.

Q: Why recommend conscious sedation for your pediatric patients?

A: Conscious sedation aids in allowing a child to better handle dental treatment. This can help prevent injury to the child from patient movement and promote a better environment for providing dental care.

Digital X-ray

Holdbrook Pediatric Dental uses Digital X-ray, minimizing radiation exposure by an estimated 75% and streamlining doctor-to-doctor communication and improves documentation of patient history.

Open Door Policy

In addition to using the latest technology and modern sterilization techniques, Dr. Wendell and his team promote an open door policy, encouraging participation in children’s dental health.

Q: Is sedation safe?

A: Sedation is safe when administered by a trained pediatric dentist who follows the sedation guidelines of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry. Dr. Holdbrook has had such training and currently performs office sedation on a daily basis. He carefully follows the guidelines set forth by the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry and the State of New Jersey.

Q: What medications may be utilized?

A: Chloral Hydrate • Valium
Demerol • Versed
Nitrous Oxide • Vistril
